Quality Control

Only clean Kinguard can be placed into clear plastic bags, some tape which cannot be removed from the Kinguard can be included. Gloves, paper, trays and items with Iodine on are a definite no! If these items are found in the waste the hospital will be banned for a three month period. If the contamination happens again then this Hospital will forfeit its right to receive Kinguard collection. All hospitals must do quarterly training and checks on the Kinguard collection process to ensure zero tolerance regarding contaminants. Bags must be tied for collection to take place.

Each quarter Hospitals in the program must email details about what training and reviews have taken place. Please email this documentation to steven@replas.com.au . Pickups will be delayed until evidence is regularly forthcoming.

Please note that if your hospital gets two strikes then you are out!

Cost

Most hospitals now have implemented bailing systems which ensures density weight and fast dispatch. All hospitals that bale their Kinguard and have forklift access to load the bales will have collection done at no charge. All none baled Kinguard will be charged a \$100 pick up fee for the service. Any bags that are not tied up will not be collected, please ensure that when pick up requests for Kinguard is implemented that a purchase number is given for invoicing purposes. When pick up is completed a invoice will be left with the dispatch personal.



Baled Kinguard weights 1400KG per trailer load, takes 10 minutes to load.



Unbaled Kinguard weights 400KG per trailer load, takes 3 – 4 times longer to load than baled forklift loaded Kinguard.

Unbaled Kinguard takes 3 – 4 more trips which cost more fuel and time.
